To the guests gathered in the Palace of Culture and Science, Copernicus Science Centre as well as to the online viewers and listeners in many countries we presented the achievements of scientists, engineers, rehabilitation specialists, organizations and institutions working for the benefit of the blind and visually impaired, especially the Polish ones. The aim of the Conference and accompanying exhibitions is to provide an opportunity to learn about the latest technical and methodological solutions created for this group of citizens. For 22 years we have been meeting with thousands of users of such products and services and have noticed a huge progress not only in the field of electronics, IT, pedagogy etc. but also in their implementation.

REHA grows year by year and has become a project tailored to our dreams and the needs of

this community. It is realized not only in Warsaw in a form of a huge, central, meeting, but also in other, biggest Polish cities. This extraordinary event consists of sixteen regional conferences in the capitals of all regions, which complement the four-day central meeting. It is thanks to such events and the presence of so many guests that we can trust that the lives of the blind, visually impaired and other disabled people will be comparable to the lives of non-disabled persons.

Since 1999, the REHA Conference has featured pioneering solutions for visually impaired attendees: speaking solutions for operating systems (DOS, Windows, IOS), print and image recognition software, web applications, smartphone software, specialized Braille note-takers, Braille text and graphics printers, 3D technology, navigation solutions, etc. This was the case this year and will probably be the same in the future.

For years REHA has been organized under the honorary patronage of the Spouse of the President of Poland. This year, it was the same. It was not possible for the Spouse of the President to come to us, but let us remind you that she met with REHA participants in 2016. We had the honor to appoint the Conference Honorary Committee, whose members were prominent representatives of the world of science, politics and NGOs. The Foundation also appointed the Organizing Committee, which watched over the best possible organization of the Meeting.

The conference events were covered by central and regional media. Keynote speeches, presentations and panel discussions were broadcasted through the Internet for Polish and foreign audience. While in previous years they were interpreted into two languages: English and Russian, this year they were interpreted into 13 languages. In this way, we will achieve another important goal of making REHA FOR THE BLIND IN POLAND a worldwide event. The Foundation cooperates with blind people and their organizations in many countries, especially in Israel, Arab countries and Central Europe. Everything is done to make Poland famous. The Foundation's initiative receives a great interest. We welcome guests from various countries, both regular conference participants and speakers, who want their speeches to be broadcasted worldwide via the Internet.

TECHNOLOGICAL EXHIBITION REHA FOR THE BLIND IN POLAND 2021

For the second time in a row we had a serious problem. During the preparations for the Conference no one could foresee the epidemic situation on the planned date of the Meeting. We hoped that the fourth wave of Covid-19 would not attack us and the REHA Meetings organized by us would take place in the largest possible numbers.

We prepared for both onsite and online variants. All visitors could either come to us or stay at home and connect with us via the Internet. Similarly, we organized the exhibition. The exhibition stands were available at the Copernicus Science Centre, but the producers and sellers could also present their products and services remotely. In this case, they could take advantage of a special broadcast and interpretation of the speeches into 13 foreign languages.



THE IDOL COMPETITION 2021

Since the first edition of the International Conference REHA FOR THE BLIND IN POLAND we have been organizing the IDOL competition. Individuals and institutions that set an example for others are honored in this competition. In 1999, during the first edition, the members of the community elite indicated persons and institutions which have done the most for the emancipation of the blind and visually impaired. At that time, outstanding rehabilitated blind people who had achieved success in their personal and professional lives were honored, as well as sighted people who had devoted many years of their work to them. Our beneficiaries liked the competition so much that we decided to make it grow and grow every year. We distinguished several categories, e.g. idol of the community, the media friendly to the blind and partially sighted, etc. When the number of candidates exceeded the acceptable limit, we decided to divide the Competition into two stages: regional and central. Regional competitions are held in all regions of Poland and their winners become candidates in the national competition.

This year's regional stages of the competition attracted over 8,000 voters who could choose from several hundred candidates. We are entitled to say that the idea of the competition is well accepted and gains more and more supporters. We sincerely congratulate the winners.



THE WORLD IDOL OF THE BLIND

For the first time ever we have chosen a World IDOL of the blind community. The original idea of the contest was modest. However, already then, i.e. during the first edition of REHA in 1999, it exceeded our wildest expectations. It has grown with each passing year. We started with people and institutions who gained trust of the elite of the community. After a few years, we appointed the Chapter, which consisted of IDOLS selected in the previous years, to also turn this into the most objective Internet voting. On the occasion of the 30th anniversary of the Foundation, we wanted to do something on an even larger scale and decided to organize the Global Competition. Everyone could take part in this voting - the blind and visually impaired, and their relatives from all over the world. Together we chose the most outstanding person from among 26 submitted candidates.

OUR GREAT WORK: REHA 2021

This has been the biggest event of its kind in the world for years. We are visited by over a few thousand guests and assisted by a few hundred volunteers, and the event takes place in two places at once: Copernicus Science Centre and the Palace of Culture and Science in Warsaw. Every year we try to beat the records of previous editions and add something new.

We initiated the REHA conference in 1999 on the occasion of 10th anniversary of starting the plan of modern rehabilitation of blind and partially sighted people. Today, REHA is a worldwide event. We combined this year's REHA Conference with the celebration of the 30th anniversary of the Chance for the Blind Foundation and organized:

- 16 substantive conferences and 16 separate integration meetings in the capitals of all regions of Poland
- Central Meeting and Conference in Warsaw on 10-13th September 2021 - at the Copernicus Science Centre and the Palace of Culture and Science
- Substantive Sessions on the topic of accessibility in the broadest sense as well as requirements for true rehabilitation and emancipation of the blind and visually impaired
- On the inauguration day of the Conference, 10th September, a concert of various Polish artists
- 3-stage IDOL Contest: regional, national and world; we presented blind and visu-

ally impaired people as well as non-disabled people, devoting their time and talents to our community, who are role models for others

- Popular and scientific lectures and panel discussions in 6 thematic blocks (over 30 panels in total)
- A technological exhibition, which welcomed over a thousand visitors, an exhibition of activities of NGOS, institutions and organizations, and a special exhibition „The World of Touch and Sound
- Gala dinner „30 years of the Chance for the Blind Foundation” for 900 people (beneficiaries of the REHA FOR THE BLIND® IN POLAND 2021 project and special guests)
- Chess tournament Szansa Chess Open Warsaw 2021 in the Palace of Culture and Science. Within this event 2 tournaments were held: Blitz and Rapid Tournament, with total prize pool 12 500 PLN
- Rubik's Cube Solving Tournament (FM and blind) Szansa Cubing Open Warsaw 2021

The Mother Elżbieta Róża Czacka cycle slam of the blind - Mother Elżbieta Czacka was a founder of the institute for the blind in Łaski. She also founded the Society for the Care of the Blind that works till this day and takes care of children and youth with vision impairment from all over the country. Łaski, according to the founder of the Chance for the Blind Foundation – Marek Kalbarczyk, is the beginning of the activity of the foundation.

For this reason, it was a starting point of this event)

- Holy Mass for the intention of the blind on Sunday 12th September
- Live Chopin Piano Concert in Żelazowa Wola
- The manifestation „We see you, and you? Do you see us?” in front of the Presidential Palace
- Visits to cultural institutions and other public places to check their accessibility for the visually impaired.

REHA has been reported on via the Internet for years. We realized that despite so many guests, not all of them would manage to reach us. First it was audio recordings in the form of interviews, then audio broadcast via the Internet, and finally full audio-video production. (In 2020, in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic, we introduced simultaneous interpretations into foreign languages and broadcast of the entire event on our online channels.) We interpreted the online broadcast of the first day of the Conference into 13 languages: English, Hebrew, Arabic, Russian, German, Lithuanian, Georgian, Romanian, French, Spanish, Italian, Bulgarian. On the second day, the main panel was interpreted into 4 languages: English, Arabic, Russian and Hebrew, and the other panels into English. Other elements of the event, such as exhibitions, chess tournaments, and a cycle slam, were carried out by the mobile studio of the Foundation. For this purpose, the Foundation employed 44 interpreters and 6 teams of experienced webcasters. We know from the statistics that it was worth it! The online broadcast was extremely successful. The reach of all mentions on the Facebook platform was 79.3 thousand, the

reach of all Facebook broadcasts was 7165.

We also provide the reach of selected broadcasts:

- FB day 1 Opening, substantive session and concert 1: 414 viewers
- FB day 2 Panel D: Culture for all: 846 viewers
- FB cycle slam: 744 viewers
- Broadcast of the exhibition on Sunday: 468 viewers
- Broadcast of the demonstration: 311 viewers.

Separate new initiatives of unprecedented scale, were tournaments:

- Szansa Chess Open Warsaw 2021
- Szansa Cubing Open Warsaw 2021.

Instant chess in the Palace was watched by 23.8 thousand people, and rapid chess by 58.8 thousand people.

These are just some sample numbers, we hope that next year our REHA will be even bigger and will have more and more visitors, those personal and online!
